ABRIEF HISTORY OF LCC

At the invitation of the Ministry of Education and Culture, the Lithuania Christian Fund began the establishment of Lithuania Christian College in the summer of 1991 in Panevėžys. That summer the college began with classes in the English language at the first Summer Language Institute. During the fall and spring of 1991-1992, students studied English full-time in the English Language Institute.

Following a move to Klaipėda in the summer of 1992, the second Summer Language Institute took place. The four-year college program began in the fall of 1992 when students began first year courses. May of 1996 saw the college's first commencement exercises. Twenty-two graduated.

In September 2000, the English Language and Literature and Business Administration majors were recognized by the Lithuanian Ministry of Education as B.A. degrees. In Summer 2002, Theology was recognized by the Ministry as a B.A. degree. In Summer 2008 the Ministry recognized Psychology as a B.A. degree and TESOL as an M.A. degree. In 2014 the MA in International Management program and the BA Communication programs were approved, and in 2015 the BA International Relations and Development program was approved. All undergraduate degree programs have been accredited.

On August 1, 2007 the official name of the institution became LCC International University. LCC now welcomes over 500 degree-seeking students from 55 countries.



LCC International University is a private higher education institution accredited as a university under the laws of Lithuania. It is a joint ministry initiative of its two stakeholders: LCC International Fund Inc. (Canada), a Canadian registered charity, and LCC International Fund Inc. (US), a tax-exempt 501(c)(3) organization. LCC International University is governed pursuant to a Lithuanian Statute and has an independent Board of Directors with representatives from Lithuania, Europe and North America.

The new President steps into LCC at a historic inflection point. Born in the aftermath of Lithuania's independence, LCC pioneered the first North American–style liberal arts education in post-Soviet Europe. That entrepreneurial spirit still defines us today—positioning LCC as more than a university, but as a global crossroads where East meets West, freedom meets faith, and young leaders from 55 nations are prepared to shape a fractured world with wisdom and courage.

Our student body is one of the most diverse in Europe, drawing large cohorts from Lithuania, Ukraine, Kazakhstan, Georgia, and Armenia, alongside students from Africa, Central Asia, and the Americas. Refugees have also found a home at LCC, adding resilience and perspective to our community. In many respects, the university stands at the hinge of East and West, offering a uniquely global learning environment.



This is a rare opportunity to lead a university unlike any other in Europe. LCC is uniquely positioned to form leaders who navigate complexity with faith, courage, and cross-cultural fluency. In a season of global instability, the President will shape how diversity becomes discovery, how conflict becomes dialogue, and how the Christian liberal arts can model peace, justice, and global citizenship.

As a distinctly Christian institution, LCC integrates faith and learning while welcoming a multi-faith student body. Chapel, residence life, and leadership development programs nurture holistic growth and prepare students for servant leadership in global contexts. Moose basketball, service learning, and student-led events such as Global Village celebrate the richness of our international community.

As LCC has developed as an institution, it has become increasingly engaged with promoting scholarly work among its faculty. Research productivity is one of the key measures of quality used by the Lithuanian Ministry of Education in its accreditation reviews and our faculty all are conducting research as well as teaching in the classroom.

Our alumni embody this mission. One graduate from Albania is campaigning for her country's parliament, advocating against corruption and for transparency. Other alumni are leading NGOs, launching businesses, and serving in churches and schools across Europe, Central Asia, and North America. Their stories reflect LCC's distinctive blend of academic rigor, faith formation, and global perspective.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMS

As part of its commitment to community engagement, LCC runs community programs that include: Evening English Language Courses, Summer Language Institute, Kids Summer Camps, and Kids Basketball Camps. Approximately 800 participants engage in these programs each year.

PEACE CENTER

LCC's peace center, grounded in Christian faith, offers opportunities for building bridges of trust, transforming relationships, and equipping communities. The center aims to strengthen, transform, and sustain servant change agents towards the creation of a more just and peaceful world. Opportunities for gathering and growing together strengthens the LCC ethos of non-violent peacebuilding guided by 4 pillars articulated below. These pillars advance our understanding and action towards peace in local and global pathways through dialogue, trainings, and action. The Center is a catalyst for strengthening communities in nonviolent social change, generous hospitality, and holistic justice to promote the greater common good of our society.

Conflict Transformation & Resilience

We work with people to transform conflict on personal, interpersonal, community and societal levels by building bridges of trust, fostering reconciliation, and strengthening resiliency. Through respectful engagement we equip communities to live justly and nurture a sustainable peace.

Applied Research & Dialogue

We work with students and researchers in the areas of conflict and peace studies and promote events that stimulate dialogue on critical issues that impact our world. The goal is to invite students, international researchers, and others to connect academic research to practice.

Action, Advocacy & Awareness Raising

We challenge a culture of oppression, promote actions which pursue justice, increase understanding and engagement in human rights issues, and strengthen positive service and citizenship. We use dialogue, learning events and workshops to empower communities to live generously.

Peace, Dialogue & Trainings

We foster an awareness of the cycles of violence and provide tools to nonviolently engage conflict, oppression, and trauma. We use human encounters to transform relationships, expand our understanding and actions toward peace, and nurture health and healing towards a more just and peaceful world.



NEW Facilities

LCC is in Phase 1 of construction of new facilities (17,000 square meters), which will include a Learning Commons, a new cafeteria, multiple study spaces and offices.

This will give our students and faculty/staff significantly more space to gather, to meet in groups, and to work individually. Completion is expected by January 2026







EXISTING FACILITIES

DeFehr Center:

Approximately 5,500 square meters of space providing 14 classrooms (averaging 25 seats per room), 1 lecture hall (80 seats), 2 computer laboratories (14 and 33 seats per room), the Balčiūnai Library, faculty offices, and most administrative offices. Completed in 1999.

Neufeld Auditorium:

A large classroom and auditorium seating 234 persons. Used for classes, large meetings, and concerts. Completed in 2002.

Michealsen Center:

Approximately 2,230 square meters containing a lobby/ lounge, some administrative offices, cafeteria, a physical training room, and a gymnasium with two full basketball courts. The gymnasium seats 1,200 persons for spectator sports events. The space converts to an auditorium seating 1,800 persons for assemblies, concerts, or conferences. Completed in 2003.

Enns Hall:

A residential facility for students on campus. Enns Hall houses 140 students. Kitchens are located on each floor; additionally, there is a student study room, a laundry room and an office for Student Life staff. Completed in 2011.

Neumann Hall:

A residential facility for students on campus. Neumann Hall houses 200 students and has 4 suites for Resident Directors and guests. Kitchens are located on each floor; additionally, there is a computer room, a study room, a laundry room, and offices for Student Life staff. Completed in 2007.
